#### SUMMARY

McLeod Lake Indian Band and Lheidli T'enneh Nation will host and deliver *Healing the Hoop 2* a wellness conference which will include a series of offerings in collaboration with Bizzybody Enterprises Inc.

Bizzybody Enterprises are a locally owned and operated Indigenous service provider company founded in 2008 and expanded in 2021 after it was determined that there was a need for a community culturally inclusive learning centre in the north and opened the doors to fill gaps in remote regions of BC.

#### The values of our organizations are:

- a) To create an environment where people can be who they want to be;
- b) To show up authentically, ready to meet people where they are at, and prepare to grow and be changed by the experience; and
- c) To be what our children aspire to, our elders are proud of, and our ancestors celebrate.

#### Our vision is:

A place where barriers are reduced, people are embraced, organizations are engaged, integrity is key, and community heals.

#### Our mission is:

Building capacities in people and organizations to create opportunities for communities to gather in a good way.

In collaboration with various urban and First Nation communities, surveys were conducted to better understand the needs of our community members. A variety of questions were asked which include, current employment status, health status, childcare, education, and training needs.

In addition to these survey results, statistics from other local wellness conferences were also referenced to inform of the gaps. From all the surveys and evaluations, the participants identified the need for further lessons to assist them in meeting their personal and professional development and employment goals.

The top 10 results were as follows:

- 1) Emotional Health & Wellness
- 2) Personal Development
- 3) Communications
- 4) Soft Skills Enhancements
- 5) Team Building
- 6) Computer Literacy
- 7) Goal Setting
- 8) Problem Solving
- 9) Social Responsibilities
- 10) Self-Esteem Make Over

Further, gender-based analysis reports such as Amnesty International's *Out of Sight Out of Mind* and the Women's Resource Society's *Peace Project* cite gender imbalances in the home, and gendered economic and employment barriers as factors affecting the health of our community at large.

Our own data, which highlights the desire for better mental health and wellness and personal development tools, combined with the research done by Amnesty International Canada and the WRS, and guided by our own traditional teachings, has led us to the conclusion that the most effective way to empower people on their own journeys of growth, is to enlist community-based healing and wellness initiatives, that are trauma-informed, and wholistic in their approach, to include seeking to address gender inequities, violence, and discrimination that were imposed through colonization. The breakdown of healthy relationships is a direct product of colonial harm caused by Residential Schools, Day Schools, and other systemic and institutionalized practices.

Therefore, we are proposing to deliver a wholistic wellness conference centered in a decolonized approach of addressing relational, family, and community health and wellness, *Healing the Hoop*. We are looking to incorporate true reconciliation into every aspect of this conference, by removing the individualistic focus that is often a major part of health and wellness events and creating a dialogue around repairing relationships and building up and empowering ourselves collaboratively.

Such a conference will address most of the top ten personal growth desires of our survey respondents, as well as the findings of the GBA reports we consulted, and the known data concerning the long-reaching effects of colonization and Residential Schools, through addressing healing and growth through the lens of how our relationships and our community are an integral part of our own growth and healing. We anticipate *Healing the Hoop 2* will have 1000 individuals participate in the three-day conference in person and/or on virtual platforms.

We are asking for your financial or "in-kind" support to contribute to this innovative and meaningful initiative. 

#### **GOALS AND OBJECTIVES**

Today there is growing recognition that the achievement of social and economic well-being for Indigenous People requires a more comprehensive approach that has greater flexibility for meeting the needs of each individual. There is a significant need to offer programming that addresses the causes of problems and not just the symptoms while working with individuals to move forward in reconciliation and begin to heal and mend together.

The healing and wellness sought by Indigenous People is based upon the return to traditional spiritual values and knowledge. As well as the integration of modern techniques to teach the skills needed for independence and self-sufficiency. We know from survey results that people are struggling to feed their families, to uphold their relationships and find fulfilling employment. The goal of this initiative is to build on to the teachings that were shared at previous local gatherings with a healing continuum that incorporates health promotion and prevention. It is the goal of this conference to encourage individuals, families and communities to enjoy a healthy balanced life and to reconcile the pain within. In order to start to *Heal the Hoop* one must be physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually balanced. Our objective is to accomplish the following:

- Build self-esteem and improve self-concepts;
- Create awareness around healthy humility that incorporates positive self-concepts;
- Encourage participants to make changes in their lives that will improve their immediate relationships in the home, their relationships at work, and in their communities for greater success;









- Guide participants in identifying their own unique strengths and assets, and how to translate their self-knowing into a better sense of security in relationships and in community;
- Introduce techniques and approaches to collaboration and strengthening personal social ecosystems for resiliency, healing, and growth;
- Offer mentorship/create support circles for participants wishing to engage in entrepreneurial opportunities;
- Provide a framework for individual and collaborative goal setting;
- Provide a trauma-informed, culturally sensitive, safe place for healing and sharing;
- ♦ Reconciliation offer a variety of healing sessions, healing ceremonies, talking circles, and teachings to deconstruct and decolonize the damage created by Residential and Day Schools, especially in regards to gender and personal and family relationships; and
- Replace feelings of alienation to reduce the impacts of trauma and adversity on individuals.

In accomplishing these objectives, the overall benefit to the participant will be a path to healing, an opportunity for reconciliation, improved confidence, skills and self-concepts to maintain a healthy lifestyle and foster healthy social ecosystems around them. This will ultimately contribute to the overall health, wellness, and prosperity of their families, workplaces, and communities, with an exponential result. Targeted participants for this project include:

- Addiction Counselors, Mental Health Workers, Social Workers, Frontline Workers & Teachers-those who experience stress on a daily basis and need time for personal development;
- Indigenous Community Leaders Band Managers, Chiefs, Councilors and Health Leads;
- Indigenous people from local FN communities;
- People who are experiencing problems in relationships and want to improve the health and wellbeing of their social ecosystems; and
- Previous local conference participants.

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#### PROCEDURES AND SCOPE OF WORK

McLeod Lake Indian Band and Lheidli T'enneh Nation will host and deliver Healing the Hoop 2 a wellness conference which will include a series of offerings. The series will be trauma-informed, and based on cultural teachings, traditional concepts of respect and sharing, and wholistic approaches to personal wellness through community wellness, that form the foundation of the Indigenous way of life. Each teaching honors one of the basic virtues essential to lead a full and healthy life and create and connect to healthy social ecosystems. Some of the key activities for the workshops will include:

- Boundary Setting and Responsibility Keeping for Healthy Relationships
- ♦ Community Engagement
- ♦ Decolonizing Gender Teachings
- Family Guidance
- Fostering Soft Skills Around Teamwork, Collaboration, and Interpersonal Skills
- Healing Through Laughter
- Personal Development Workshops
- Personal Testimonies
- Reconciliation and Healing Intergenerational and Intimate Relationship Trauma
- Reframing Narratives to Heal Self-Concepts and Reclaim Healthy Social Space
- Singing and Drumming
- Smudging and other Ceremonies
- Traditional Peer Support Models such as Healing Circles
- Using Artistic Expressions to Reduce Feelings of Alienation

#### **EVALUATION**

- Qualitative evaluations through surveys and worksheets related to the conference.
- Quantitative results with follow-up 12 weeks after completion of the project. This will include number of participants attending and completing workshops, and the feedback they provided at the sessions.
- The overall benefit to the participants will be improved self-concepts, healthier social ecosystems and stronger support networks, increased positive concepts around gender, more comprehensive soft skills, a better balance with self-concepts and humility, more tools to approach maintaining health and wellness in a decolonized and wholistic relationships-based way.
- This will ultimately contribute to the overall health, wellness, and prosperity of their families, their workplaces, and the communities to which they belong.

At Bizzybody, community building is the foundation to how we approach physical, mental, emotional, and spiritual health. Healthy social ecosystems create healthy individuals and healthy individuals create healthy social ecosystems. Our conference will address these issues through workshops, ceremonies, and keynotes that address all aspects of finding a better way with each other and with ourselves. The conference is traumainformed and culturally-based, and the vast majority of presenters are Indigenous knowledge keepers, field experts, artists and innovators.
